

EMAINATIONS - Pupils should be spending at least one hour per week revising for each subject at home using revision guides and workbooks. There are also a number of apps which pupils can use for revision, a couple of popular free apps are Quizlet, Gojimo and Chegg flashcards. These can be used to help pupils revise a wide range of subjects and are useful for revising at home on phones and tablets.


KS3 pupils will also have an assessment in the summer term to track their progress in technology. The best way for younger pupils to prepare is to ensure all class and homework is always completed to a high standard to ensure success. Parents can track behaviour for progress and support with homework through the Class Charts app.

Child Development - Year 11 have been working hard to complete their controlled assessment tasks. Pupils have been analysing the benefits of different toys before planning and carrying out activities with a child aged 1-5 to compare their development with physical, intellectual and social milestones. The deadline for coursework is Thursday 4th April. Year 10 have been working on their understanding of how to recognise, manage and prevent childhood illnesses. We have been investigating the impact of diet on children's health and pupils used a range of sources to carry out their research.



Both Year 10 and 11 need to revise for their examination on 10th June. The exam is 50% of the final grade. A good way to revise is by using the Quizlet app. Pupils can join Mrs. Fern's Child Development class using the link https://quizlet.com/join/Ynchr3HHk . Pupils will find a range of study sets to help with revision and they can choose methods of revising to suit their personal learning styles.

Design and Technology - Year 11 Design and Technology continue to work on their Non-Exam Assessment (NEA) and are currently working on their analysis and evaluation. Their NEA is worth 50% of the final grade and pupils encouraged to re-visit and improve their work before final assessment and moderation.

Technology Enrichment

CAD club (computer aided design) takes place on Tuesday 3.15-4pm in the hub with Mrs Ferns and Mr Blake.

Pupils will be able to learn how to use 2D Design when designing profiles for laser-cutting or engraving. Within 2D Design is a vast array of image manipulation, pattern design, vectorising, font design and alignment tools (to name just a few) that make it the ideal platform for graphic design where the results could be for sublimation-printed fabrics, packaging graphics, display and presentation.

The club will be open to pupils in key stage 3 and 4. Pupils that attend regularly and produce high quality work may also be able to enter the TechSoft 2D Design Competition 2019.

Hair and Beauty - Year 11 have been working extremely hard and already secured 75% of their GCSE marks, most of them are working towards achieving distinctions. Year 10 have already sat their external exam.

Both years are working on their next assignments:

Year 10 Enterprise Assignment - To research the hair and beauty market and identify/create a new product or service that can be introduced into a business and design a business plan.

Year 11 are on their last assignment – The Design Brief. To design and create a look for the front cover of a magazine based on the 1960's.
