The Dean Trust Games is a traditional athletics competition for Year 7, 8 and 9 pupils which began in 2019. It involves all the Dean Trust secondary schools and this year's event is taking place at Victoria Park Athletics Track in Warrington on Thursday 11th July 2024. Our pupils will be taking part in a variety of track and field events and we are sure that the LDA boys and girls teams will do us proud.

The annual Dean Trust Active Challenge event took place in the magnificent surroundings of Knowsley Hall on Tuesday 25th June 2024. This year we had over 800 pupils from across 11 Dean Trust schools taking part in either a 2K or 4K run. Due to the large numbers, the event was split into three parts with the primary children running first, followed by the secondary pupils/staff 4k race and finally the secondary 2K race, which included representatives from the staff of all 11 schools, cheered on by staff, pupils, families and friends. Due to the hot, dry conditions, the main focus was to complete the run safely this year but pupils and staff gave maximum effort in challenging conditions to complete the run in their quickest time possible. Despite the challenges, the pupils enjoyed the event immensely, demonstrating both their competitive drive but also the camaraderie of running with their friends and representing their school. Special medals were presented to the top 3 runners of each race but all those who completed the race were presented with a medal by our Chief Executive, Mr Kapur. A fantastic time was had by all and we look forward to many more Dean Trust School events in the future.
